Changes to my 329 Card

All changes or requests regarding your 329 card must go through the State of Hawaii. Your medical provider is not able to assist with any changes, as the state requires all change requests come directly from the patient. You can access the Change Form Packet at <u>https://</u> <u>health.hawaii.gov/</u> <u>medicalcannabisregistry/patients/changes</u> -to-information/

A Change Form Packet is required for the following:

- Replacement Card—if your card is lost or stolen
- Update Information—such as changes to grow site, caregiver, name (i.e.

married), phone number,

email, etc.



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q. Do I qualify for a 2-year renewal? A. The State of Hawaii has recently approved a 2-year renewal option; however, since there is no cost savings with a 2-year renewal, most providers prefer to see patients annually. Green Wave Medical does not offer 2-year renewals at this time.

Do I qualify for medical marijuana?

The state of Hawaii regulates, and frequently updates, the list of approved medical conditions for the medical cannabis program. As of December 2020, the approved conditions are as follows:

- Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS)
- Cancer
- Glaucoma
- Lupus
- Epilepsy
- Multiple Sclerosis (MS)
- Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA)
- HIV
- AIDS
- PTSD
- Cachexia or wasting syndrome
- Severe pain
- Severe nausea
- Seizures
- Severe and persistent muscle spasms, including but not limited to, those caused by Chron's disease

This list is subject to change at any time. Your medical provider will determine whether or not you qualify for the Hawaii Medical Cannabis Program.

What are the Rules?

GROWING: Patients who receive a 329 card are permitted to grow up to 10 plants at the grow site registered with the State of Hawaii. All plants must be appropriately tagged. For tagging regulations, go to: <u>https://health.hawaii.gov/</u> <u>medicalcannabisregistry/patients/growing-medical-</u> marijuana/

POSSESSION AND TRANSPORTATION: Registered

medical cannabis users are allowed to have up to four (4) total ounces of marijuana in their home and one (1) ounce of marijuana on their person when outside of the home. Marijuana should be transported in a sealed container, in privatelyowned transportation only, and should not be used anywhere in public. <u>Marijuana should not be used</u> at any time when you are operating, or plan to operate, a motor vehicle.

CAREGIVER: Caregivers are registered at the time of the patient's visit/application process and will also receive an official 329 caregiver card from the State of Hawaii. There is no extra fee for assigning a caregiver. Caregivers are allowed to:

- Grow cannabis plants for the registered patient (up to 10 plants)
- Purchase cannabis products at local dispensaries for the registered patient

Dispensaries on Oahu

There are 3 dispensaries, with a total of 7 locations on Oahu. The staff at local dispensaries are friendly, knowledgeable, and accommodating. If you are new to THC and CBD products, pay a visit to your local dispensary to find what products are best for your medical condition.
